

__ December 2017 __ A VIEW FROM THE PULPIT

King Herod the Great is one of the most interesting characters in the Christmas story. He was called "the Great" for some good reasons. In a country that was politically volatile and had changed rulers frequently, Herod brought stability and ruled for thirty-six years.

An ambitious builder, he reconstructed the Temple of Solomon and returned that symbol of Israel to prominence. Herod could also be generous. When a great famine struck Palestine in 25 BC Herod remitted all taxes from his burdened people. He even melted down his own golden plates to help the plight of the hungry.

But Herod had one terrible character flaw that grew worse with age. He was intensely jealous and protective of his power. If he suspected anyone of wanting to usurp the throne, he had them killed.

Alerted by the Wise Men that a new King had been born, Herod immediately tried to find Jesus and murder Him. He went so far as to kill all baby boys under two in Bethlehem. Under no circumstances would he yield his throne and surrender his power.

Do we ever see traces of Herod in ourselves? True, I don't think any of us would kill for power. But at a far more subtle level, we want to have absolute control over our own lives. We want to call our own shots, erect our own temples, and rule our own kingdoms. And when our control is threatened, don't we want to eliminate the source of the threat.

To encounter the newborn Jesus at Christmas is a joyful experience. We all like Babies and celebrations. But to kneel with shepherds and Wise Men



and proclaim Jesus King of our lives is quite a different thing.

As we approach this Christmas, there are decisions to be made by each of us. Who will this Christ child be? A cute and darling Baby? Or a strong and life-changing King? How will we receive Him? As the Day arrives let our choice be clear. May we have the wisdom and strength to kneel at Bethlehem and make Jesus Our King.


CHRISTMAS REPRESENTATIONS

John's whole life was about the sea. At an early age, he became a sailor, eventually joining the Royal Navy of Britain. He loved the life of the sailor and he lived it. He was a course and vile man who it right in with all the other sailors. When he left the Navy, he soon became a captain of another boat. This boat carried

cargo, but not just any cargo – humans. He oversaw a slave ship. He had no problem with his life's work.

On one journey, the boat that he was in experienced a great storm. Things were not looking good for John. Like many people, he made a deal with God. If he would survive, he could consider this Christianity thing. He did survive, and true to his word, he began to read a Bible and some Christian literature. By the time he got home, he had given his life to Jesus. Unfortunately, he did not give up the slave trade (he did give up drinking and cussing). Eventually, God softened his heart to see the horrors of his trade.

Post slave trade, John became a couple of things. He became an abolitionist who inspired William Wilberforce. Wilberforce would become the most important figure in the fight against the slave trade. John also became a preacher. It took many years to get there, but once he did, he was all in.

The most famous work John undertook (at least to most of us) was that of a hymn writer. He would try to write a hymn for his congregation whenever he could. He became famous for many of his hymns. We do not sing most of the songs he wrote, but there is one that we all know and love. John Newton, the horrible slave trader, was the author of "AMAZING GRACE." I imagine that these words were always in his heart from his conversion. A man that was involved in one of the most disgusting trades knew what it was like to be a "wretch." He also knew how amazing the grace of God is that would save a man like him. Remember, the next time you sing that song – God used a slave trader to write it. He can use us to do incredible things, also.
