

Love, Cupid, hearts, chocolates, cards, and flowers will be everywhere – on Valentine's Day; February 14th. On that day we celebrate love and friendship. But where did this holiday of affection come from?

The origins of Valentine's Day are murky. We do know that the ancient Romans celebrated the feast of Lupercalia, a spring festival, on the 15th of February. With the introduction of Christianity, the holiday moved to the 14th of February – the saint day that celebrated several early Christian martyrs named Valentine. But somewhere along the way, Valentine's Day came to represent romance. The romance we associate with Valentine's Day may spring from the medieval belief that birds select their mates on February 14th. During the Middle Ages, human lovebirds recited verse or prose to one another in honor of the day. "Shall I compare thee to a summer's day?" wrote William Shakespeare. And poet Elizabeth Barrett Browning expressed love this way:

How do I love thee; let me count the ways. I love thee to the depth and breadth and height

"Will you be my Valentine?" Nowadays, people often ask this of their loved ones in greeting cards. Probably the first greeting cards, handmade valentines, appeared in the 16th century. As early as 1800, companies began mass-producing cards. Initially these cards were hand-colored by factory workers. By the early 20th century even fancy lace and ribbon-strewn cards were created by machine.

I remember sometime about the 7th or 8th grade getting valentines with SWAK written across the flap of the envelope. I don't know whether kids today still do that or not but back in the day it meant "Sealed

with a Kiss". The card itself would have an X or several X's on it somewhere that meant the same thing.

The X we use to denote a kiss comes from the Middle Ages, when the cross of Saint Andrew was used for a signature on important documents by those who couldn't write. This was a sign of binding honesty, and after writing the X, it was kissed to further guarantee faithful performance of the obligation. So X became associated with a kiss.

John 3:16 tells of God's ULTIMATE Valentine, His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

"For God so LOVED THE WORLD THAT He gave his only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life"

God sealed His Valentine not with SWAK or with an X but with the Cross of Calvary.

On February 14th as we think about Love let's give thanks for God's **valentine** to us, our Savior Jesus Christ.


