A VIEW FROM THE PULPIT

It was a bleak, rainy morning as the couple entered the diner for breakfast. Several others were there but no one spoke. The mood at the diner seemed to reflect the news of the day with its daily recitation of murder, mayhem, and discouragement.

At the other end of the diner they noticed a young mother with a little girl of probably around four. Suddenly, the child broke the silence by asking her mother, "Don't we say grace here, Mommy?" Behind the counter, the cook looked at the little girl and said "Sure we do, honey. Will you say it for us?" The little girl bowed her head, clasped her hands and said in a clear loud voice, "God is great and God is good, and we thank Him for our food. By His hand we all are fed. Give us, Lord, our daily bread." It seemed as if the diner's atmosphere changed and people began talking to one another.

One of the dangers of modern life seems to be being labeled a "religious" person. Somehow the "freedom of Religion" that the framers of our constitution wanted to preserve has evolved into a "freedom from religion" that leads to the exclusion of most things spiritual from public life. Among the words of Thomas Jefferson inscribed on the walls of the Jefferson Memorial are these: "God who gave us life gave us liberty. Can the liberties of a nation be secure when we have removed a conviction that those liberties are the gift of God?" As author of the Declaration of Independence, with its appeal to the Creator as the ultimate source of human rights, Jefferson — perhaps in spite of himself — endowed our national beginnings with the idea that faith and freedom are inseparable partners.

In the wake of September 11, 2001, "God Bless America" was spontaneously sung at meetings and sporting events and even played at the end of some newscasts. It was as if our nation was awakening from the sleep of indifference and complacency into which our material success had lulled us. But what about NOW? As we approach July 4, 2017 let our prayer be for a revival as a nation — for God's promise is still there for us.



REV. MARION H. CURRIE

Rev. Marion H. Currie, age 100, died April 9, 2017, at the Twin Lakes Community in Burlington. Rev. Currie was pastor at Buffalo from 1974 to 1982



and those of us who were members at that time have fond memories of him and his wife Barbara who died in 2012.

Rev. Currie was in many ways a traditional Presbyterian minister of the old school, but he was never stern. On the contrary, he most often

had a ready smile and a twinkle in his eye. He and Barbara were always willing to reach out to help members and support the young people of the church. We remember their hospitality in hosting a gathering at the manse each year following the Christmas Eve service, a tradition that was continued by some later pastors.

In 1980 Buffalo celebrated the 100th anniversary of the present sanctuary and Rev. Currie organized a special service for the event. He had commemorative communion tokens distributed to all members as a keepsake.

Rev. Currie retired from Buffalo in 1982 but he continued to be active in Fayetteville Presbytery (later Coastal Carolina) for many years before moving to the Twin Lakes Community. Our condolences go out to his son and daughter and their families.
