I had coffee with a friend at the beach the other day. At the house I do coffee one cup at a time in the Keurig. I had forgotten how good coffee in a full pot smells. The sense of smell – how rarely we stop to appreciate it!

I poured the coffee and sat down at the table with my friend, wrapped my hands around the mug. It felt good to the touch because I had just gotten soaked to the bone as I walked over to his house. Touch – another dimension I seldom give conscious thought to. How often I eat mechanically with my mind elsewhere.

I think I do better when it comes to hearing and sight, not that I see or hear all that well but that which I see, like a sunset over the ocean or the moon rise on a clear summer night helps me to sense the presence of the One who made it all. A friend whose eyesight has grown less and less over the years, remarked, "I never looked so keenly at things! Seeing things maybe for the last time, each object had an extreme beauty."

Why don't we thank God for our senses? And as we move into fall, the leaves will change and we will be presented with clear evidence of God's marvelous creative ability. A friend penned these words to a song called "Master Painter".



When I woke up this morning the Master Painter took out his pallet and brush and colored the sky. With clouds orange gold, and amber and purple So royal He put them on as His robes for the day.

I think he was feeling what the Psalmist did when the Psalmist said "O taste and see that the Lord is good... Psalm 34:8

Maybe he meant it more literally than we usually imagine.

As I drink my coffee I might realize that far too often my devotional life (and maybe yours too) has been strictly centered on the mind – on words and concepts. But worship in the Bible includes so much more. Don't you think we should ask God to enable us to truly worship Him with our whole being?

Might we sense the totality of His magnificence and really worship, Worship Our Great Creator with every one of our senses, our whole being.
